SWIMMING

Four children represented the school at the CSSA Swimming Gala at The Sands Centre on Wednesday. Hollie Park and Thomas Barratt won gold medals in breaststroke and freestyle respectively with Peyton Jesse receiving a silver medal in backstroke. They were joined by Logan Murdoch and together they won silver medals in the medley relay and bronze medals in the freestyle relay. It was a very productive morning with some great competitive swimming and Cummersdale School came 2nd overall.

The children in Y1/2 completed their two-week intensive block of swimming last week. Progress was rapid and almost all children can swim now without arm bands with many starting to develop their strokes and technique.

UNIFORM - A FEW REMINDERS
