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STAFFING NEXT YEAR

Next year there will be a slight change in our staffing at school. Miss Fleming will be taking Reception class. Having worked throughout the school and gained a wealth of experience in all age groups, she is looking forward to having her own class. Mrs Scott will not be class based, instead concentrating on her role as SENCo and helping to drive school improvement throughout the school. I must thank Mrs Scott for her three years in Reception, taking over the class at a difficult time, developing the provision both in and out of the classroom and seeing the Early Years through a successful Ofsted Inspection.

All other teachers and teaching assistants are remaining where they are with the exception of Miss Maclagan who will be moving to Y3/4 in addition to Mrs Sharp.

The above timetable shows when SATs are taking place for Y6 children next week. In order to ensure that children arrive in plenty of time and are settled and ready, the school will be offering breakfast to Y6 children. Children may arrive at school any time after 8.15am and should access school via the fire escape. It is expected that all tastes will be catered for. The actual papers will not begin until just after 9am.

KS1 SATs will not be taking place in May this year as in previous years. There is no statutory assessment for schools at this age (Y2) anymore. However, the children will sit the papers at a later stage in the year as they will be useful for tracking pupil's progress internally.

Children in Y4 will complete a Maths Tables Test in June and children in Y1 will take a Phonics test also in June.

SUN CREAM

With some hot weather forecast we are keen to minimise the risk of sunburn as much as possible as we know how uncomfortable this can be.

Many of you have provided your children with sunhats which is great and there have been some very cool sunglasses being worn. Suncream can also be provided by you for your children with bottles named which the teachers help administer on days when the sun is particularly strong. Alternatively, a good covering first thing in the morning at home, would suffice for most children.

The children in Reception will have received a separate letter as they spend a considerable time learning outdoors.

CULTURAL AND DIVERSITY WEEK

During the final week of half term (w/b 20th May) we will be celebrating Cultural and Diversity week. During this week we will be highlighting the richness of the world's cultures, particularly those that make up our school community. We are lucky to have families from a wide range of localities including: Pakistan, Oman, Malta, South Africa, Italy, Scotland and Poland. This week will provide us with an opportunity to deepen our understanding of the values of cultural diversity and learn more about the people and world around us.

Children will spend the week learning about the different cultures that make up our community through various activities organised by their class teachers, this will include looking at beliefs, dress, food, music and dance. Children are asked to talk to family members over the next week in preparation. Children can research a culture of interest or collect resources that can be used to present to others about their culture. This will then be shared with their class and then used for a whole school display which parents will be invited to come along and see at the end of the day on Friday.

On Thursday we will spend a day focusing on Hinduism. Sakhya will be coming into school to provide a fun day of events. They will have the opportunity to look at traditional dress, the younger children dressing up as Hindu Gods and Goddesses, while the older children will be involved in Bharet Nathyam dress up and dance. The younger children will have a Ganesh dance session. They will experience the use of conch shells, bells, drums and other instruments and artefacts, before ending the day with face painting. If there are any children who are not allowed to have their face painted, please can you inform their class teacher.

We look forward to learning more about the makeup of our community and broadening our understanding of the cultures that make up the world we live in. Y6 TRANSITION

MABIE FARM PARK

On Tuesday 21st May, the whole school will be going to Mabie Farm Park in Dumfries. This is a replacement trip for the one to Chester Zoo in January which was cancelled due to bad weather. It has proved to be very successful in the past when we have taken the whole school. During the day, there will be opportunities for feeding lambs, looking at the animals as well as having lots of fun.

We will travel by coach, leaving school at 9.00am, returning by approximately 3.30 -3.45pm. The children in Reception, Y1 and Y2 will all be provided with a school packed lunch. We ask that those in Y3 – 6 bring their own. We will have a supply of spare water for anyone who gets extra-thirsty.

Uniform will not be needed on the day, but appropriate clothing should be worn bearing in mind the weather. Please do bring a waterproof jacket and some spare clothes as children often can get very grubby and sometimes wet on things like grass sledges. The school will be allocated a party room at the farm where lunches and bags can be kept secure.

With all the teachers and teaching assistants going on the trip and with just enough seats on the buses, we feel that we have got enough supervision so there is no room for additional parents on this occasion.
