CATCHMENT AREA CONSULTATION

Cumberland Council are proposing to adjust the catchment area boundary for the Amberwood Housing Development on Dalston Road. There is a consultation period which was opened on 7th October 2024 and will last for 6 weeks closing on 17th November 2024. All details are available by clicking on the link below. May I remind parents who provide packed lunches for their children to be mindful of products which contain nuts.
